#### **Rector's notes for March 2025**

I write this with a smattering of snow drops appearing in various places, but when otherwise winter is still very much in charge, even if the afternoons are staying a little lighter for longer. Perhaps I might try to cheer you up with something about our new electoral rolls?!

You may have read about this elsewhere, but this is an important moment in the six yearly cycle of our list of what is effectively people who would like to be formally connected with one of our churches in this lowkey way.

Every six years all existing lists of names are wiped clean and we're required by Church of England rules to make a new roll in every parish. I'm keen to encourage anyone who feels any sort of affinity to church at all to sign a new electoral roll form. The only requirements are that you are aged 16 or older, are baptised, and that you live in the parish (the ecclesiastical parish, that is) – if you're not sure which parish you live in you can look it up on the website achurchnearyou.com. It's also possible to join the roll if you live in another parish but regularly come to the church whose roll you wish to be on. And if you are involved in two different churches you can be on the roll of both parishes, so long as you only vote in one.

One of the glories of being the established church in England is that everyone is a parishioner (whether you like it or not) of one parish or another – anyone can approach their local church to be baptised, married or for a funeral service. You don't need to be on the electoral roll

for those three things, but for the people who do all the work in our churches it's a real encouragement that others in the parish who we may not see in church very often none the less chose to sign up to join. If you choose to give us your email address as well as your postal address, then we can keep in touch with you about special events and services, and other things affecting the life of the church.

For all electoral roll members there's no cost involved, and it means you can participate in elections for church officers (or indeed, become a church officer or a member of the church council).

At one level this might all sound a bit dry. But at another level it's nothing less than a connection with the worldwide-and-throughout-history body of Christ – the tragically fallible, but also God-inspired collection of people who affirm the love of God, the presence of God with us, the saving grace of God in Jesus – all of which has the capacity to direct us into the way of peace, wholeness, forgiveness and mercy. #### The Sky at night



During March, you can expect to see planets like Jupiter still visible in the evening twilight, though becoming harder to see as the days lengthen; however, Saturn will not be visible due to its ring plane crossing. Mercury may be visible very low in the southwestern sky during evening twilight, reaching its greatest eastern elongation.

There will not be a total solar eclipse in 2025, but the next best thing — a total lunar eclipse — will occur twice.

On 13<sup>th</sup>–14<sup>th</sup> March, the full Moon will travel through Earth's shadow to create a lunar eclipse – a spectacular lunar light show during which the Moon's surface turns reddish. This lunar eclipse will be visible in parts of Europe, including the UK, though observers here will only catch the early phases before moonset in the pre-dawn hours of 14<sup>th</sup> March.

The phenomenon, known colloquially as a 'blood moon', will last for over an hour and will unfortunately for us be best viewed from North and South America.

A second total lunar eclipse will occur on 7<sup>th</sup> / 8<sup>th</sup> September, this one best seen from Asia.

North Americans will miss out on the second total lunar eclipse entirely, though observers in the UK will glimpse it during moonrise on  $7^{\text{th}}$  September.

#### **Calne Without Parish Council**

#### What we've been doing in the last month

The Parish Council has continued to consider and respond to planning applications and requests for Highway improvement works.

On 27<sup>th</sup> February 2025 the referendum was held on the Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan. Thank you to all of you who took the time to vote. At the time of writing the election has not happened, but I hope by the time that you read this that the plan has been 'made' and Calne Town Council and Calne Without Parish Council have succeeded in getting the neighbourhood plan into local planning policy and now are in a stronger position to help shape local development. This point marks the end of many years of hard work from a number of people in the locality.

Many of you will have seen the recent installation of the play equipment on Petty Acre, as a parish council, we are very proud to have been able to provide this equipment for the children of the village. We hope all the young families enjoy using it.

Over the last month we hope many Studley residents saw the consultation on the proposed reduction in the speed limit to 20mph. Getting the reduction in speed limit in Studley has been a really important part of our Road Safety project over the last few years. Sometimes it feels like things take so long when we have to liaise with other agencies and follow their due processes. We are patiently waiting to see the outcome of the consultation and hope that swift implementation of the proposals will follow.

We continue the countdown to the start of the new 'Derry Hill & Studley Parish Council' This means that in May what remains of Calne Without Parish Council after the boundary changes becomes Derry Hill and Studley Parish Council. This is the biggest change to Parish Council structures for many years and we are looking forward to the opportunities these changes can bring to the locality.

A Parish Council is the voice of the community, they advocate for the wishes of the community within Wiltshire Council and with other groups that they work with. They cannot do that without people standing to be Councillors. This is not as intimidating as it sounds and can be a really rewarding way to have an input into the community.

On 1st May 2025, the local elections in Wiltshire will be held and all seats in the new Derry Hill & Studley Parish Council will be up for election (11 in total) If you think you might be interested in becoming a Parish Councillor and helping continue all the good work listed above I would encourage you to come along to a Parish Council meeting (all Parish Council and committee meetings are held in public) to find out more about what Parish Councils do and how they make decisions. All the dates for Parish Council meetings can be found on our website. Further background info can be found at;

If you would like to stand to be a Parish Councillor nominations open on 12<sup>th</sup> March at 10am and close 2<sup>nd</sup> April at 4pm.

Locally there are two opportunities to find out more about what it means to stand as a Parish Councillor. On 5<sup>th</sup> March the Wiltshire Association of Local Councils are holding an information session online 6pm-7pm, please visit <a href="https://www.wiltshire-alc.org.uk/council\_events/your-parish-council-needs-you-march-5th/">https://www.wiltshire-alc.org.uk/council\_events/your-parish-council-needs-you-march-5th/</a> to sign up.

Alternatively, if you want to attend an in-person event, we are holding our Annual Parish Meeting on the same evening, starting at 7.30pm in the Lansdowne Hall Derry Hill, the main focus of this meeting will be to provide information on becoming a Parish Councillor.

#### Reporting issues

Most months we have the Parish Steward visit us to carry out jobs as required, he can do small jobs associated with the highways. If you have an issue that you think he might be able to help with then please feel free to email me with photos and details of the concern and we can see if he is able to help.

We regularly receive reports of works required that we pass onto Wiltshire Council for their attention. Did you know that there is a quick and easy way to report items such as potholes and issues with street lighting straight to Wiltshire Council? Search 'my wilts' app and follow the instructions. Once you have set up an account reporting is quick and simple.



# The Hub - serving Derry Hill, Studley, Old Derry Hill and Sandy Lane in North Wiltshire




# Farewell to Calne Without Parish Council; hello to Derry Hill and Studley.

Calne Without Parish Council was founded in 1890 and currently covers the rural area around Calne, including Derry Hill, Studley, part of Ratford, Pewsham and Old Derry Hill, Sandy Lane, Mile Elm, Stockley, Calstone, Lower Compton and High Penn.



Following a governance review by Wiltshire Council in 2022, major changes will be coming into effect in May. Calne Without will be replaced by a new Civil Parish of Derry Hill and Studley, comprising Derry Hill, Studley, Pewsham, Old Derry Hill, Naish Hill, Sandy Lane and Bowood. The remaining parts of the current Parish will be transferred into Calne,

or the Parishes of Bremhill, Heddington, Cherhill, Compton Bassett and Hilmarton. We have been planning hard for a smooth transition to the new arrangements.



For the last three years, we have been able to keep the Parish Precept (raised as part of the Council Tax) unchanged at £21.72 for a Band D Property. This has been the lowest in the area by a country mile. Unfortunately, the Precept for the new Parish will increase significantly for two main reasons: firstly, we will have half the tax base; and secondly, we will no longer have Community Infrastructure Levy funds from developments around Calne, which we have been using to fund projects and grants. (This is why I personally voted against the proposed

changes.) On the positive side, the New Parish will be much more focussed.

On 1<sup>st</sup> May, we will have elections for the new Parish Council. This will have nine Councillors representing Derry Hill and Studley Ward, one representing Pewsham Ward and one representing Bowood and Sandy Lane Ward.

Our Annual Parish Meeting will be at 7:30pm on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> March in the Lansdowne Hall. As well as reporting on our work over the year, we will be using the meeting to give a better understanding of what is involved in being a Parish Councillor. We will also explain the process of standing for election. If you're interested in finding out more, then please do come along.

I was elected to Calne Without Parish Council in 2021 and have had the honour of serving as Chair for the past two years. I believe we have got a lot done as a Council. This includes the new play equipment on Petty Acre, the community orchard in Studley Gardens and the reduction in speed limit through Studley Crossroads. We have delivered road signage improvements on the Devizes Road, Sandy Lane, Mile Elm Road and other places and have procured and operated two speed indicator devices. We have carried out footpath improvements, held a series of sustainability events, run a free thermal imaging camera loan scheme and delivered a free tree scheme.

More progress is in the pipeline, with a 20mph speed limit in Studley and Norley Lane recently going through the formal consultation process, plans for white gates for Old Derry Hill and Pewsham, and we are waiting on the outcome of bids for substantive funding to resurface the path between the A4 and the village hall carpark, and for further traffic calming measures on Church Road.

I have really enjoyed the last four years and would like to take the opportunity to thank our Parish Clerk and colleagues on the Council for their hard work and support. I very much look forward to helping to make the new Derry Hill and Studley Parish Council a success.



#### **Derry Hill and Studley during World War II**

As we approach the 80th anniversary of VE Day, we take a look back at how WWII impacted life across Derry Hill and Studley. **Gladys Daniels** gives us a glimpse of life in her book "Memories of Derry Hill Village".

Gladys says "in the years 1937 to 1945 the Reverend Basil Palmer became our Vicar. He was with us during the War years and was appointed the leader of the Home Guard. His parents and stepsister, Miss Westmore, also lived at the Vicarage with him. Mrs Palmer,



the Vicar's mother, and Miss Westmore were great workers for the Red Cross during the War, and regular weekly meetings were held at the Vicarage to make up bandages and knit socks and helmets for the soldiers. Mrs Palmer and Miss Westmore were very clever at producing plays and a beautiful Nativity Play was performed in the church, the

stage being erected in the Chancel. They produced one play called The Belles of Beaulieu, when the cast included a great number of villagers wearing lovely Victorian dresses and with the children dressed as flowers".

"The war years were very difficult years for us all, especially with the rationing of food. Everyone was issued with

a ration-book, clothing coupons, furniture coupons and many other things. Restrictions on buying anything were very severe, and every

person was issued with an identity card and a gasmask, which by law we had to carry with us at all times – the children carrying theirs to school. Families from the danger zones were evacuated to the village and all who had a room provided accommodation for them. The children attended our school, and many long-lasting friendships were made. Westonbirt Girls School was evacuated to Bowood House, and they almost filled our church on Sunday mornings. Lady Kitty Petty Fitzmaurice, later Baroness Nairne, elder daughter of Lord and Lady Lansdowne sold War Saving Stamps which cost 6 pence each (old money".)

Gladys goes on to explain that "living so near to several important aerodromes often made us tense, especially at night, listening to the rumble of the aircraft overhead and sometimes hearing the thud of a bomb being dropped. They were really terrifying years. Great celebrations took place when peace was declared, and also great sadness for many who had lost someone very dear to them".

The Derry Hill War Memorial remembers 6 men who gave their lives during the Second World War:

Herbert H Fortune lived at 45 Church Road and was killed in Action on 17th April 1943. He was a Sargent in the RAF Volunteer Reserve and stationed at Mildenhall, Suffolk. Herbert was the radio operator and gunner in a Stirling Mk III. They took off from Mildenhall on route for their target of Mannheim-Ludwigshafen Germany. Herbert was 25 years old. He was the son of Robert and Sarah Jane Fortune (buried at Christ Church, Derry Hill) and husband to Lillie Fortune of Chippenham. Herbert lies in the Rheinberg War Cemetery in Germany. His grave is inscribed – At the going down of the sun we will remember you.

Pilot Officer Herbert George Haddrell was born in 1913 and lived in Studley Lodge (Bowood White Gates) with his parents and went to Derry Hill school. On 15th October 1944 he was at the controls when his Halifax aircraft took off from Sandtoft on a night cross-country training flight. While flying at 12,000 feet, the port inner engine caught fire and the crew were unable to quell, or control, the flames as they spread towards the fuselage. Three crew members managed to bail out from the aircraft but four of the crew

(including Herbert George aged 30) stayed with the aircraft as the rear gunner had difficulty in escaping from his turret. The Halifax smashed into the heavily wooded Copreston Fell on Glendhu Hill in Kielder Forest. His body was returned home to Derry Hill and buried at Christ Church.

Captain Geoffrey Kenelm Hood Irish Guards was born in London on 21 Nov 1920 to Albert Oscar Hood (Agent to Lord Lansdowne) and Theresa Emily Marjory DIGBY. Geoffrey Kenelm Hood passed away on 24 Jun 1946 in Hammersmith, London, England.

Lance Corporal Thomas Sandell James Hampshire Regiment 5th Bn. Died 8th February 1944 aged 27 years old. Thomas is buried at Minturno Cemetery, Italy. He was the son of Edward and Louise James, husband of Vera James, of Derry Hill. Thomas and Vera Haddrell had married early in 1942. At dawn on 7 February 1944 the 5th Battalion repulsed another determined attack on Ornito, inflicting considerable losses on the enemy. That night, as part of a general attack by 138 Brigade, they attacked the neighbouring mountain, Cerasola, which was still in German hands.

Charles Hope Fitzmaurice - 7th Marquess of Lansdowne. Charles was a Captain in the Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry. He was killed 20th August 1944 in Italy aged 27. Charles is commemorated on Panel 2 of the Cassino memorial. Cassino War Cemetery lies in the Commune of Cassino, Province of Frosinone, 139 kilometres south-east of Rome.

**Lieutenant Lord Edward Norman Petty-Fitzmaurice** was the youngest son of Lt.-Col. Henry William Edmund Petty-Fitzmaurice, D.S.O., M.V.O., 6th Marquess of Lansdowne, and his wife, Elizabeth Caroline Stanley Hope. He was the brother to Charles Hope Lansdowne. He was in the 3rd Battalion, Irish Guards and was killed on 11 Aug 1944 aged 22. He is buried at Tilly-sur-Seulles, Departement du Calvados, Basse-Normandie, France.






#### **Book Club Review**




listening; non-judgemental and he fully understood that his volunteering didn't just benefit others, it made *him* happy too. At the event he was given a well-deserved award.
