# Rev. Sarah's thoughts

Just like any other month, February contains a mixture of annual secular and religious landmarks. Usually, February brings Shrove Tuesday, with its ancient tradition of eating pancakes, and the more recent association of the French phrase 'Mardi Gras' with Gay Pride events. However, this year Shrove Tuesday is delayed until 4 March (the day before Ash Wednesday, see below). Maybe your focus will be on St Valentine's Day and its celebration of romantic love. Other annual commemorations which fall in February include: Groundhog Day in the USA; Waitangi Day in New Zealand; Chinese New Year; the Hindu Festival Vasant Panchami, which highlights the coming of spring; and Presidents' Day in the USA.

For Christian believers, February begins with the festival of Candlemas on 2 February, 40 days after Christmas Day. Luke recounts the story of Joseph and Mary taking the 40-day old baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem: they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") (Luke 2:22-23). It is this event which we remember and celebrate on 2 February, and it concludes our Advent/Christmas/Epiphany celebrations. Lots of churches keep their Crib on display until 2 February for this reason. According to the Church of England Calendar, the festival is called 'The Presentation of Christ in the Temple', which is a bit of a mouthful! Its shorter name is 'Candlemas' because traditionally all the candles which would be used in Church over the following year were blessed on this day.

So, in February, our attention turns away from God's glory as revealed in Jesus' birth and early ministry. Instead, our attention turns to God's glory as revealed in Jesus' temptations, suffering and resurrection. I remember on one occasion attending a Candlemas service where there was a manger placed at one end of the Church, and a cross at the other. During the service, there was a moment when we physically turned our focus away from the manger and towards the cross, as a physical reminder of this pivotal point in the Church's year. This year, Easter is quite late, so Lent doesn't begin during February as it usually does. (Ash Wednesday is on 5 March). Even so, we begin to look ahead to Lent and Easter from the beginning of February. As we do that, may each

one of us perceive more of God's glory, and so become better equipped to reflect his glory in the world.

# **Calne Neighbourhood Policing Update**

#### Crime and incident updates

- •On 10/12/2024, unknown persons have gained access to outbuildings and removed several items and a small quad bike in Lowbridge, Bremhill.
- •On 27/12/2024 at 17:30hrs, report of a two-vehicle collision in Sandy Lane. Thankfully no-one was seriously injured.
- •On 16/01/2025 at 22:45hrs, two vehicle collision reported in Stanley Lane. 1 driver arrested on suspicion of drink driving, driving not in accordance with licence, no insurance. The other driver was arrested on for being found in possession of a bladed article and drink driving. Enquiries are ongoing regarding the matter.
- •On 16/01/2025 at 23:09hrs, a vehicle collided with a deer causing a following vehicle behind to also hit the deer and cause the vehicle to flip onto its roof in old Derry Hill. The driver of the second vehicle was taken to hospital as a precaution.

#### **Pro-active Patrols in our rural areas**

In response to a slight increase we have seen in hare coursing and rural crime in our area, the team have been carrying out targeted patrols in our rural communities.

This is alongside similar work being done by the Rural Crime Team. PCSO Cook has been patrolling farmland and villages in the areas of Yatesbury, Bremhill, Derry Hill, East Tytherton and Foxham.

Speeding and road safety operation
Between Thursday 9th and Sunday
12th January, PC Dorey from the Calne
Neighbourhood Policing Team, with
assistance from PC Swanborough and
colleagues from the Chippenham
Response Team, has been out across
the county conducting speed checks.



This proactive effort was carried out during particularly hazardous weather conditions and highlights the importance of speed awareness to keep our roads safe for everyone.

Speed checks were conducted on the A4 Studley, East Tytherton, Compton Bassett. 9 tickets for speeding were issued.

# The Sky at Night

There will be a very unusual alignment of seven planets on 28 February when Mercury joins six other planets that are already visible in the night sky.

Six planets – Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune – are currently visible in the night sky. During just one night in late February, they will be joined by Mercury, a rare seven-planet alignment visible in the sky.

The eight major planets of our Solar System orbit the Sun in the same flat plane, and all at different speeds. Mercury, the closest planet to the Sun, completes an orbit – a year for the planet – in 88 days. Earth's year, of course, is 365 days, while at the upper end,



Neptune takes a whopping 60,190 days, or about 165 Earth years, to complete a single revolution of our star.

The different speeds of the planets mean that, on occasion, several of them can be roughly lined up on the same side of the Sun. From Earth, if the orbits line up just right, we can see multiple planets in our night sky at the same time. In rare events, all the planets will line up such that they all appear in our night sky together along the ecliptic, the path traced by the Sun.

Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter and Saturn are all bright enough to be visible to the naked eye, while Uranus and Neptune require binoculars or a telescope to spot.

In January and February, we can witness this event taking place. The planets are not exactly lined up, so they will appear in an arc across the sky due to their orbital plane in the Solar System. During clear nights in January and February, all of the planets except Mercury will be visible – an event sometimes called a planetary parade. On 28 February, though – weather permitting – all seven planets will be visible, a great spectacle for observers on the ground.

Wassail Night is a Twelfth Night tradition with pagan roots and has been practiced in Britain for centuries. The idea is that people go out into the orchards, drink in hand, to sing to the good spirits of the apple trees hanging toast on them to encourage the



guardian spirits whilst banging saucepans to scare away the bad spirits. Much revelry is to be expected.



Here we did things slightly differently - due to the poor weather and the inclusive hospitality of Rev. Sarah Errington - we celebrated in Christ Church in Derry Hill.

On arrival, children and adults alike decorated their hats with winter foliage and made crowns from coloured cardboard to wear during the festivities. They enjoyed a cup of tea and some homemade apple cake and zucchini bread made by local volunteers

while hard at work creating their masterpieces.

We then gathered together for a blessing of the Christmas Tree by the Rev. Sarah and everyone sang "O Christmas Tree" before the Master of Ceremonies,



Peter Prater, looking resplendent in cloak and ivy decorated top hat, enlightened us with the history of the apple in Great Britain - who knew the first orchards were implemented by the Romans? - as well as detailing the history for us locally and John Spencer, Head Gardener at Bowood, who planted so many apple trees in the area and is even present in one of the stained glass windows in the church.

This was followed by a Wassail song which we all joined in and sang

before being treated to a dance by the Chippenham Morris Men, organised by Richard Aylen.

Finally, we put our pieces of toast out for the trees and banged our saucepans in earnest before singing again and enjoying the dancing by the Morris Men whilst supping on a welcome mug of Lamb's Wool, a beverage made from hot mulled cider, which we saluted in old Norse tradition, "Drink Hail!"

#### Calne Without Parish Council

#### What we've been doing in the last month

The Parish Council has continued to consider and respond to planning applications and requests for Highway improvement works.

Work on The Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan has continued at pace over the Christmas break. You may recall the consultations carried out earlier this year. The plan has now passed through Wiltshire Council and the process of examination. You may have recently received your poll card for a referendum being held on Thursday 27th February in relation to the Calne Community Neighbourhood Plan. We continue on the countdown to the start of the **new 'Derry Hill & Studley Parish Council'** This means that next May 25 after the local elections Calne Without Parish Council, will become Derry Hill and Studley Parish Council. This is the biggest change to Parish council structures for many years and we are looking forward to the opportunities these changes can bring to the locality.

A parish council is the voice of the community, they advocate for the wishes of the community within Wiltshire Council and with other groups that they work with. They cannot do that without people standing to be Councillors. This is not as intimidating as it sounds and can be a really rewarding way to have an input into the community.

The **impending local elections** bring a period of reflection for everything that Calne Without Parish Councillors have achieved over the past 4 years, some of the highlights include.

- •a huge amount of work a lobbying in relation to Road Safety within the parish. One of the biggest achievements being the reduction in speed limit through the Studley Crossroads.
- •We have also hosted two successful Green energy days and a fabulous science workshop to help celebrate Joseph Priestley,
- •Supported numerous local groups with grants to help them with their work, including providing funds to help improve two school libraries.
- •A project to install additional defibrillators across the parish. 3 additional installed at the time of writing and three more in the installation/planning stage.

- •We now have two speed indicator devices that are used throughout the parish. Lots of work continues on trying to improve road safety through the parish.
- •Imminent installation of much requested play equipment on Petty Acre.

On 1st May 2025 the local elections in Wiltshire will be held and all seats in the new Derry Hill & Studley Parish Council will be up for election (11 in total) If you think you might be interested in becoming a parish councillor and helping continue all the good work listed above, I would encourage you to come along to a parish council meeting (all Parish council and committee meetings are held in public) to find out more about what parish councils do and how they make decisions. 


#### **Book Club Review**




We all found the book to be an enjoyable, uplifting read which celebrated friendship although opinions on the ending of the book differed!



## **How to Tell If Your Older Relative Needs More Help**

## Has their appearance changed?

If personal hygiene or






