Rev. Sarah's thoughts

"For I know the plans I have for you", declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future".

Jeremiah 29:11

This is one of my favourite Bible verses; I'm sure you'll hear me mention it again sometime! For now, I want to focus on one word: 'hope'. It seems to me that hope is in very short supply outside the church, and we all need to know the reality of Christian hope.

In the world around us, there is very little hope on offer. Climate change, war, famine, disasters, struggling economies, the ongoing fallout from the pandemic - all contribute to a future which looks very bleak.

But we can't live without hope. If there really is no hope of a better future, then the only alternative is despair. The great thing about the Christian hope is that it is a great deal more than a mild optimism (of the sort we exercise when we hope that our children might get into a good school, or that we might get a particular job). True Christian hope looks to the future with certainty.

Christian hope is sure and certain because it is based on God's promises. A song I used to sing at school had the refrain: God has promised. God never breaks a promise he makes. His word is always true. And God has promised us some wonderful things. He has promised us that we will be raised from the dead (Acts 24:15; 1 Corinthians 15:52). He has promised that he will make a new heavens and a new earth (2 Peter 3:13; Revelation 21:1). He has promised that he will wipe every tear from our eyes (Revelation 21:4). Our past experience, and our knowledge of Scripture, show us that God always keeps his promises, and gives us confidence that he will keep his promises for the future.

So, in these uncertain times, no matter the circumstances, let's remember that we have every reason to hope. Let's share that hope with our non-believing friends, family and neighbours, especially when they are in despair. And let's echo Paul's prayer below, as we pray for ourselves, and for one another:

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

(Romans 15:13)



The Sky at night

In July and August 2025, UK sky watchers can look forward to seeing the planets Venus and Mars close together in the evening sky.

The "Buck Moon" (full moon) will appear on July 21st.The 'Buck' refers to the time of the year when male deer start to grow their antlers.

In August the full moon will be the Sturgeon Moon. This name comes from the time of the year when large sturgeon are caught in the Great Lakes and Lake Champlain in North America.



The Perseid meteor shower starts July 17th and goes on until August 24th, peaking on 12th August.

The gas giants Jupiter and Saturn will be prominent in the southeastern sky, rising earlier in the evening as the month of July progresses. Jupiter will be close to the Moon on August 15th.

Venus and Mars will be close together in the evening sky in July, especially noticeable from July 9th to 17th. Earth will be catching up to Jupiter and Saturn, making them appear brighter and rise earlier (around 10 pm by the end of July).

Saturn will be its closest to Earth on August 12th so appearing bright and large in the constellation of Capricornus. Look near the Moon.

You can find out more about this scheme and where their nearest participating store is on the Boots website here - Recycle your medicine & vitamin blister packets



The Shops

Derry Hill and Studley has a long history of small businesses which have served the community. Gladys Daniels tells us about her memories in her short book "Memories of Derry Hill Village".

In the early 1900's there were several small businesses, one being a baker's shop where Mr Fred Bradfield baked his own bread, so there was plenty of home-baked bread available. This bread shop was in the cottage in Church Road that is today called The Granary.

There was also a village undertaker run by Mr Elliot and Mr Caleb Holley (where the Fiat Garage is today in Old Derry Hill). Elliot and Holley were also a wheelwright and blacksmith's shop where farm carts and waggons were built and repaired.

Milk was delivered to everyone's door by Fred



Angell who lived in Angell's cottage on Church Road. Fred used an uncovered bucket with a ladle to measure the various amounts of milk needed.

The Village Shop

In the 1930's the village shop was in one of the cottages opposite the War Memorial, where Mr and Mrs Charlie Wiltshire lived and ran a very prosperous grocery business in which most things could be bought. Naturally, not the variety available today, as there were no deepfreezes, but plenty of good wholesome food. In addition, he had his own slaughterhouse where he killed his own pigs and cured his own bacon - so there was always plenty of fresh pork and lovely home-cured ham at Christmas. or whenever it was possible to afford one. Charlie employed a man to drive round the village regularly each week, when we



were able to buy fresh pork, including liver, kidney and delicious home-made faggots. Four faggots for sixpence (old money). The slaughterhouse was not attached to his cottage but was situated on the corner of Studley Crossroads which is to-day Studley Gardens.

In 1932 a Miss Dorothy Chivers started a small shop in her parents' house, making and selling her own sweets and chocolates. She cycled round the village selling them and many other items such as cotton and haberdashery, which was most useful. In 1942 Dorothy married Mr Tom Strange and moved next door to her parents in 1949, and a small shop was built. These two cottages and the small shop make up the former Village Stores – currently under re-development. In 1951 Mr Charlie Wiltshire retired and his business was transferred to Mr and Mrs Strange, who also became the newsagents through taking over the agency from Mr Ben Wiltshire. In 1956 Mr and Mrs Strange were Postmaster and Postmistress, and in 1958 they had the Spar Supermarket built as it is to-day. There was a very happy occasion when many well-wishing friends came to see Mr Charlie Wiltshire perform the opening ceremony of the new Spar Supermarket. In 1975 the business was transferred to Mr Simon Strange when he became postmaster.

The Village Post Office

In the 1920's and 1930's the Post Office was in the cottage on Church Road which today is called The Granary. The Postmaster and Postmistress were Mr and Mrs Cyril Thomas. Mr Thomas also sold bicycles, did repair work and ran a taxi service. Later the family moved to Calne and set up a business known as Thomas's Coaches. The Post Office was then transferred to Mr and Mrs Ben Wiltshire, brother and sister-in-law of Charlie Wiltshire. Ben ran a hairdressing business for men and children, using what was the showroom for cycles as a salon (today this is the small cottage called Catkins).



Here men were able to have a haircut, shampoo and shave for a few pence. There was no provision for ladies' hairdressing included, but as many women still wore long hair, there was no demand for hairsets and waves. Ben ran a small taxi service and news agency. In the 1930's many in the village had a reasonable radio, often with a very large loudspeaker, which was run with an accumulator that needed regular weekly charging. Ben Wiltshire provided this service to the village – with service later transferring to Bulson in Chippenham who collected and returned accumulators on a weekly basis. When Ben retired the Post Office was transferred to Mr and Mrs Strange at the Village Stores. Going right back to the 1900's there was also a hairdressing shop for men call The Barber's Shop situated next door to the pig slaughterhouse at Studley Crossroads.

Crime and incident updates

Drug (use) activity in Studley Gardens

Concerns have been raised to us regarding persons loitering near to the visitor car parking spaces to the rear of Studley Gardens smoking cannabis. The Calne Neighbourhood Team are fully committed to keeping our communities as safe as possible, we have increased our patrols in this location and will continue to do so over the foreseeable future. Mobile CCTV van deployed to monitor traffic in Studley and Derry Hill

On Wednesday 14th May, The Mobile CCTV van was positioned in various locations in Calne and Derry Hill to monitor the traffic in the locations. The vehicle can also be used as a base for officers to complete clerical tasks and conduct foot patrols in the area. 


Book Club Review

Demon Copperhead by Barbara Kingsolver.

Demon Copperhead is a compelling and powerful novel. It is a reimagining of Dickens' David Copperfield set in Lee County in the Appalachian Mountains, a world of rural poverty, plagued with the horrors of America's opioid addiction epidemic.

From the moment of birth onwards, the novel charts Demon's life in detail. He manages his mother's alcoholism, dependence on drugs, inappropriate relationships with men and marriage to the abusive and violent Stoner and eventually her death. We then follow Demon through the care system who see the



young boy as nothing more than cheap labour. He has brief success on the school football field, which leads to his own spiral of drug abuse. He falls in love for the first time but loses her to drugs.

This all sounds so depressing, but the power of the novel lies in Demon's narrative. We loved his spirit and humour when coping with all that was thrown at him.

Having read J D Vance's 'Hillbilly Elegy' this year, we felt that 'Demon Copperhead' was a more realistic and honest portrayal of Appalachian life, the treatment of America's rural poor with the focus on the opioid crisis that places the blame on doctors and drug companies. Acknowledgements: -





Wellbeing notes

This too shall pass

A London friend, Vivien, was strolling around Avebury with me. She adored the ancient, mysterious stone circle. I love it too. But on this particular day I had a busy schedule. In the north-west quadrant, it all



became too much. "There's so little time," I fretted.

Vivien laughed. "Look around. There's literally no one here but us. You'll get to your appointment, but worrying won't help, I promise you."

I looked around properly then, at the stones that measure time in unfathomable ways. And I realised that my worries were as fleeting as a breeze compared with Avebury.

Understanding that our woes are transient is a well-established principle in meditation, both in stillness and in action. An example: I like to exercise on a rowing machine, finding that its rhythm can become quite meditative. As imaginary oars slide through the water, and an imaginary boat scoots forward, the distance covered is displayed on the screen before me. At times the metres look like years rushing by. The 1970s turn into the 1980s and so on, through the millennia until we reach the year 5,000, aka 5km, when I generally stop.

What will the world look like in the years 3025 and 4025? What will our descendants be like? Perhaps they will view us, with our paperback books, rather as we view the faraway papyrus generations. One thing doesn't really change: our ability to feel all the emotions. Hence that comforting expression in hard times: 'This too shall pass'.




