



Sarah's ponderings

By the time you read this, the Olympic Games will be fading from your memory, but as I write, we're in the midst of all the excitement! Team GB has won a number of gold medals in really exciting contests – the men's mountain-biking, the women's quadruple sculls, and the men's triathlon all come to mind. And the individuals and



teams concerned can inspire us all, in Tom Pidcock's words, never to give up. He'd been forced to withdraw from the Tour de France a couple of weeks earlier, as he'd got Covid. In the Olympic mountain-bike race, he had to fight his way back to the front of the race after his bike had a puncture shortly before the half-way point. The women's rowing team were in second place for much of their race but overtook the Dutch boat as they crossed the finish line. In the triathlon, Alex Yee was 14 seconds behind the leader at the beginning of the final lap of the run, and really struggling, but as he said, "I didn't give up," and 400 metres before the end of the race, he took the lead, and went on to win.

"Never give up" doesn't mean that we should always plough on, regardless of circumstances. The American gymnast Simone Biles made the wise decision to pull out of the Tokyo Olympics, when she realised that she needed to put her own mental health first and take care of herself. There are times when we all need to take a step back, and take stock, before going ahead once more, possibly in a different direction. As I write, Simone Biles has won a team gold medal in Paris, and she's expected to do great things in the individual women's competitions.

Christians can learn a great deal from sportspeople; the writer of the letter to the Hebrews in the New Testament of the Bible pictures us as competitors in an athletics stadium, cheered on by all the Christian believers who have gone before us. S/he urges us to run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus . . . If you are a Christian, be inspired by our Olympians, and by those who have gone before us, not to give up. If you'd like to explore what it might mean for you, please make a start by talking it over with a Christian friend, and/or joining us for a Church service sometime very soon.

The History of the Telephone Kiosk – Part 2

In the April issue we saw how the 1920/1 K1 (kiosk1), the first GPO built kiosk, was constructed of 3 concrete panels with a wooden door. The K1 was not popular



and in 1924 a design competition was held to design a replacement. The winner was Giles Gilbert Scott. His design is the first time a phone kiosk starts to look like the iconic red box.

Made of cast iron with a wooden door the **K2** was the first time kiosks were painted bright red and had the familiar domed roof, but it was very large and far too expensive.

The K3

A cheaper alternative was sought and the GPO turned again to Giles Gilbert Scott as designer but insisted on using cheap concrete. The K3 retained some of the style of the K2 but was much smaller and included backlit "telephone signs" and was painted white with red doors and red window surrounds (see picture below).

The K4

The K4 was an unusual kiosk that performed two roles. Essentially an extended K2 in design and construction with a rear section holding a stamp dispensing machine and a post box

Thus, the K4 was essentially a mini–Post Office and the idea was to save opening more sub-post offices!

It was both enormous and difficult to site with access needed for four sides it couldn't be placed against a wall and equally took up most of the pavement, prompting lots of complaints.

K3 K4



The K5 was designed to be erected inside buildings and events as a temporary feature. It was predominantly seven pieces of plywood and could be packed into three cases – it didn't survive!

What's on

A walk through the life and times of the Lansdowne Arms, Derry Hill

1841. the Great ln Western Railway was from built London Paddington Chippenham. As it does today – the railwav offered a fast and reliable route to London, Lord Lansdowne.

commissioned Sir Charles Barry, architect of



the Houses of Parliament, to build a new lodge on the western perimeter of the park at the point closest to Chippenham station.

The result was the Golden Gates - built on the site of the original Lansdowne Arms (formally the Shelburne Arms). The old Lansdowne Arms was demolished and the new pub was built on its current site in 1843. The Grade II listed pub is built of ironstone with ashlar dressings, stone slate roof and ornate ashlar Tudor style chimney stacks.

In his memoirs the Reverend Stafford Brown (the first vicar of Derry Hill) noted that before Christ Church was built in 1840, drinking had prevailed to a fearful extent at Derry Hill – with numerous public houses spread across Derry Hill and Studley. Whilst the Reverend Brown and his wife waited for the Vicarage to be built on Church Road, they were accommodated in an old pub which may have been the defunct old Lansdowne Arms. He describes how the sign had been removed and the interior thoroughly whitewashed. The old pub had a porch and had been made to assume quite a comfortable appearance. Stafford Brown particularly noted in his memoir that this had been the third public house that had been closed in just three years.

One of very first landlords of the new Lansdowne Arms was William Smith from Derbyshire accompanied by his wife Elizabeth. In 1851 records note that the Smiths kept lodgers in some of the 6 rooms they had upstairs. Two of the lodgers were Susannah Underwood a nurse from Stoke and a 2-year-old child in her care called Emily Colston from Oxford (wonder what the back story to that is?).



In late 1851 the Smiths moved on and the advert was put into the newspapers seeking a new landlord to take on the pub.

Henry and Jane Stadden arrived from Stepney, London to run the pub in 1852. By all accounts they were the life and soul of Derry Hill. On the 11th January 1859, the Derry Hill Church Choir gave their annual concert in the Lansdowne Arms. A grand piano had been transported from Bath by Mr Milsom free of charge just for the evening. Reverend

Fletcher led the programme of entertainment with the Curate of Derry Hill performing 'non piu Andrai' and 'Figaro'. The evening ended with a rousing chorus of 'God save the Queen'!

Tragedy struck later in 1859 when Henry died of consumption at the age of 48. He was buried in Christ Church graveyard (very near the main door) on 10th November 1859. Sadly, the headstone is weathering and recently fell in two. Jane took on the pub as Landlady at the age of 45 - continuing to serve the village and to care for her children. Tragically, death came calling at the pub in 1864 and took Jane, leaving her children as orphans. The probate records show Jane had provided for her children - with one of the main beneficiaries being her brother in Marlborough who then cared for her children.



By July 1892, the Nimrod Stagecoach stopped regularly at the Lansdowne Arms on route to Bath. Pulled by a team of 4 horses, passengers could sit inside or atop of the carriage. Each day (except Sundays) the Nimrod would depart the Bear Hotel in Devizes at 10:45 and (via Rowde and Sandy Lane) arrive at the Lansdowne Arms at 11:25. Passengers would alite and proceed to Bath arriving by 13:30. The return journey left Bath at 16:00 – expecting to arrive at the Lansdowne Arms at 17:55

In 1898 the pub hosted a New Year's Eve celebration. Mr John Hayter was the Landlord and had issued invitations to many residents from the local 'hamlet'. These were joined by a party of 20 from Devizes. 'Auld Lang Syne' was heartily sung at midnight by the company with clasped hands. The New Year was welcomed with good wishes for prosperity and happiness being expressed. I am guessing the party from Devizes staggered towards home on a very dark road.

By the early 1900's cycling was a widespread past time. The Lansdowne Arms was a regular stop for cycle excursions from Bath – cyclists wearing jackets, shirts and ties and their trousers tucked into their knee length socks.

Throughout this time the local Hunt would use the green in the front of the pub as a meeting point – an activity of its time in history, with weekly reports in the newspapers advertising the fact. The papers would detail some hunts – the direction, speed and who was involved. The hunt would continue to meet into the 1950's – a real spectacle for the locals.





In the 1940's the pub hosted the Derry Hill Home Guard. There is a photo of the Home Guard pictured outside Lansdowne Arms. Front and centre in the photo is Reverend Basil Palmer (9th Vicar of Derry Hill). The Home Guard were mobilised to protect the village from possible German attack. There is the story of oil drums buried halfway down Old Derry Hill by the Home Guard that could be filled with petrol and set alight to help from German attack the repel Chippenham direction. By 1953 Mr and Mrs Norfolk ran the pub - moving to the Dumb Post in 1955.



By the 1970s Evelyn and Penny Jones ran the pub. Penny's Steak pies were legendary.

Between 1998 and 2003 John and Karin Chester ran the pub. In April 2005 following John's death, a tribute was paid by Karin, saying "John always said Derry Hill was a village full of genuine people, we enjoyed

our time there very much. He enjoyed raising money for the school and liked to get involved with the community. I think that is how people will remember him".

Since 2003 there have been c.15 managers running the Lansdowne Arms. Today the Lansdowne Arms has its doors open once again and is providing a very warm welcome to all passing travellers and locals.


Best Kept Village (BKV) is a Wiltshire-wide competition run by the Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) to:

The Sky at Night



Throughout the month many different planets will be visible. As Mercury can only be observed in twilight, it is very hard to see without a telescope. However, if you look East on 6th September, it will be at its highest altitude in the morning sky, so you will have the best chance of viewing it then.

Four planets will be at opposition in 2024; Saturn moves into opposition on 8th September, Neptune on 21st September, Uranus on 17th November and Jupiter on 7th December. All the planets in the Solar System orbit around the Sun. At certain points during these orbits, the Earth finds itself directly between the Sun and another planet. This is the moment at which that planet is said to be 'in opposition'. When Saturn is in opposition for example, Earth is between the Sun and Saturn.

Fortunately, every night in the South the two largest planets, Jupiter and Saturn, will be visible to the naked eye. Again, with a telescope on a clear night you might be able to spot Saturn's rings or Jupiter's moons!

If you're about at night on 18th September there will be a partial lunar eclipse when the Moon passes through a part of the Earth's shadow. September 22nd is the Autumn Equinox, when both day and night will be nearly exactly 12 hours.

Calne Without Parish Council

What we've been doing in the last month.

Normally the summer months mean that activity here at the Parish Council goes a bit quieter and we can all catch up a bit on any outstanding jobs! However, this summer the council certainly doesn't seem to have taken a break. We have continued to respond to planning applications and liaise with Wiltshire Council over road safety issues within the Parish.

I am pleased to report that the proposed 40mph speed limit through the Studley Crossroads should now be implemented by mid-October, we await the implementation works to be completed by Wiltshire Council as the highway authority.

In other road safety news, we have successfully advocated for an extension to the barrier at the bottom of Old Derry Hill, the improvements to this barrier should be completed soon.

We are now on the countdown to the start of the new 'Derry Hill & Studley Parish Council' we are starting to write the budget and confirm all the costs of the work that we already do and hope to continue to do under the newly shaped and named council starts work. We would love to hear from local residents about where we might look to set our priorities. We have created a short survey that we would love as many people as possible to complete. The survey will be open until the end of September.



As a parish council we are the voice of the community, we advocate for the wishes of the community within Wiltshire Council and with other groups that we work with. We cannot do that without people standing to be Councillors. This is not as scary as it sounds and can be a really rewarding way to have an input into the community. Next May 2025 the local elections will be held and we will be looking to fill the 11 seats for the new Parish Council. If you think you might be interested in becoming a parish councillor, I would encourage you to come along

to one of our meetings (all our council and committee meetings are held in public) and find out more about what we do and how we make decisions. All the dates for our meetings can be found on our website.

We wanted to say a big thank you to all of you who came to our recent engagement events. We have already received a lot of feedback from our proposals for play equipment on Petty Acre. 
The humans say you don't need any musical knowledge at the start so everybody is welcome to come.

Arrests made in connection with Keyless vehicles stolen in Wiltshire.


We have arrested three people in connection with the theft of several high value keyless vehicles.







Wellbeing notes

Listening to nature's symphony



Midnight. Outside, a tawny owl is hooting. In the morning, the buzzard takes over: a high, childlike cry. For a few moments, the sound is drowned out by a plane from the Americas, passing overhead. But the plane goes; the buzzard is audible again. And more quietly, here in the garden, there's the musical flutina robins and of goldfinches, the cooing of woodpigeons, and the rasp of crows. One day, soon, the geese will arrive, honking overhead as they remind us of snowy places, far away in the north.

The symphony of nature is incredibly varied when you stop to listen – and all of it tells a story. Wind in the trees

around Derry Hill change like ocean currents when storms approach. Streams gush noisily after heavy rainfall. Boots squelch muddily or perhaps crackle through autumn leaves.

Listening mindfully to the symphony of nature can be a calming meditation. For the space of ten breaths, focus on what you can hear to your left then, for another ten breaths, tune into the sounds on your right. And then, finally, listen to your own, inner sounds, such as breathing or even your body's pulse. The aim is to listen without judgement, understanding that everything and everyone is a part of nature. We are all, according to the poet Kahlil Gibran, 'sons and daughters of life's longing for itself'. Appreciating that insight can bring bliss.
