



Editorial

Here we are solidly into Autumn, with the beautiful autumnal colours breaking through the sometimes-gloomy weather.

Another reminder of the changing seasons is the 10^{th} of this month - World Porridge Day. Film buffs will be looking forward to the 68th BFI London Film Festival $9^{th}-20^{th}$ and the annual round of party conferences starts with the Labour Party Conference 22^{nd} to 25^{th} Those highbrow amongst us will be off to the Cheltenham Literature Festival $(4-14^{th})$

If you happen to be heading south, and I mean seriously south, on *October 2nd* an *annular solar eclipse* will pass over parts of the Pacific Ocean, southern Chile and southern Argentina. (During an annular solar eclipse, the moon drifts in front of the sun while it's slightly farther from Earth than during a total solar eclipse, so it doesn't completely cover the sun's disk. Instead, it leaves a distinct ring of light around the moon, hence why an annular solar eclipse is also known as a "ring of fire" solar eclipse. At the point of greatest eclipse in the Pacific, the moon will obscure 93% of the sun's centre, creating a "ring of fire" visible for 7 minutes and 25 seconds).

However back at base we have the inspirational, exciting and informative **Derry Hill and Studley Wellness and Sustainability weekend** (19th and 20th). All sorts of taster sessions including a Sound Bath, Yoga and Pilates will occur. Information and talks on sustainable energy and more will be staged. So, cancel everything else and come



and enjoy - look out for details of events which are in this magazine.

Rector's notes for October – a Season for Remembering

You might think I'm a little bit ahead of the game here, because of course Remembrance Sunday is still a little way off, in November.

But what I wanted to write about here is a different opportunity for remembering which is happening in five of



the six churches in our benefice. This is particularly to remember our family members who have died – whom we still love but see no longer. There's a very long-standing tradition of inviting the families of those for whom we have done a funeral to a special service, but this year we wanted to broaden out the invitation to others too.

Amongst us there'll be huge variety in the ways we grieve for our loved ones. Some of us adjust to their death quite quickly, especially if they've lived to a good age and been very much ready to die. But for others of us, it's a great deal harder.

However, the process of grief is for you, and wherever, and whenever your loved one's funeral was, this is an invitation to come to a special Remembering Service. We'll sing some well-known hymns and listen to a reading and a poem or two. The centrepiece of the service is the chance to come up and light a candle for your loved one, and to hear the name of your loved one read out — whoever it is you'd like to remember. Perhaps they lived and died at the other end of the country, or even in another country. Or maybe in this, or the next-door parish. Whoever, or wherever, please know that you are warmly invited to come and remember them in your parish church.

It's not about wallowing in despair. But it is an opportunity to acknowledge our grief, and to be reminded that our loved ones are safe in God's safe keeping.

Should I ring 999 or 111?

If it's a life-threatening emergency call 999, if you need medical help fast, but it's **not** an emergency, use NHS111 Online or call 111. When you dial 999 or 111, a call assessor will answer and guide you through a series of questions which are



important and its vital that you listen, stay calm and answer as best you can to ensure appropriate care and services are actioned.

Life threatening emergency - 999

- Chest pain
- Difficulty in breathing
- Unconsciousness
- Severe loss of blood
- Severe burns or scalds
- Choking
- Fitting or concussion
- Drowning
- Severe allergic reactions

If a defibrillator is appropriate, they will direct you to the nearest available unit in the village.

NB the 111 service does not have access to the defibrillator database. If they think your situation is life threatening, they will redirect you to the 999 service.


An article from the past – some 70 years ago!



Book Club review


Brotherless night by V. V. Ganeshananthan

This is a story mainly set in Jaffna during the long years of the Sri Lankan civil war.

The narrator, 16-year-old Sashi, an aspiring doctor, gets swept up in the violence and confusion at the start of the uprising by the Tamil Tigers in response to the oppression forced upon them by the Sinhalese majority.

As the war progresses Sashi becomes a medic at a field hospital for the Tigers.

She wants to help people regardless of their political beliefs but soon finds it difficult to navigate the moral dilemmas caused by the war. The fractured groups fighting each other, divide families and challenge the moral



consciousness of those trying to figure out the right thing to do. When the Tigers turn on civilians and members of their own community Sashi teams up with her professor and begins to document the human rights violations that have been committed by all sides.

This is a book of deep moral complexity - there is no "right side" in this civil war - it is a story of both individual and national grief. It is harrowing to read in places due to the atrocities being described, so it is difficult to say it is an enjoyable read but is definitely a powerful book which resonates with the fighting still happening all around the world today.

The Sky at Night

It's an exciting time of the year! With a most frequent rate of around 25 meteors per hour, the Orionid meteor shower peaks around the night of 21 October. This shower features particularly fast meteors which can leave persistent trains. The best way to see them is to look out for the flashes or streaks of light that come from small particles of the famous Halley's Comet crashing into Earth's atmosphere.



There will be a Super Full Moon on 17th October. Super because the Moon travels an elliptical orbit and when it is at its closest (perigee) it looks slightly larger.

The Rev. Lionel Borradaile Bell

The 10th vicar of Derry Hill was Lionel Borradaile Bell (1945 to 1949). Lionel was born in Pretoria South Africa on 11th January 1890 to Adam Borradaile Bell and Jane Anderson. Lionel married Alice Dorothy Chadwick in London in 1930. They had 5 children - Evelyn, Allan, William, Douglas and Louise.

Lionel and Alice left Derry Hill in 1949 to settle in Southern Rhodesia (now Zimbabwe) - selling lock stock and barrel in a sale at the vicarage. In Rhodesia they started the Borradaile Trust - a non-sectarian, non-racial, and non-denominational organisation to look after the elderly founded on Anglican tradition and run on Christian principles. Today their legacy is thriving in Marondera (a small town just outside Harare).

Lionel passed away in Marondera on 22nd February 1965.

Calne Without Parish Council

What we've been doing in the last month

The Parish Council has continued to consider and respond to planning applications and requests for Highway improvement works. We are working closely with Wiltshire Council to realise the ambitions of our road safety feasibility study that we shared at the public meeting in 2023.

I am pleased to report that the proposed 40mph speed limit through the Studley Crossroads should now be implemented by mid-October, we await the implementation works to be completed by Wiltshire Council as the highway authority.

We are now on the countdown to the start of the new 'Derry Hill & Studley Parish Council'. We are starting to write the budget and confirm all the costs of the work that we already do and hope to continue to do under the newly shaped and named council when it starts work. We would love to hear from local residents about where

we might look to set our priorities. We have created a short survey that we would like as many people as possible to complete. The survey can be found by scanning the QR code or clicking this link. https://forms.office.com/e/HtXw7rPV8C The survey will be open until mid-October.



As a parish council we are the voice of the community, we advocate for the wishes of the community within Wiltshire Council and with other groups that we work with. We cannot do that without people standing to be Councillors. This is not as scary as it sounds and can be a really rewarding way to have an input into the community. Next May 2025 the local elections will be held, and we will be looking to fill the 11 seats for the new Parish Council. If you think you might be interested in becoming a parish councillor, I would encourage you to come along to one of our meetings (all our council and committee meetings are held in public) and find out more about what we do and how we make decisions. All the dates for our meetings can be found on our website.

Reporting issues

Most months we have the Parish Steward visit us to carry out jobs as required, he can do small jobs associated with the highways. If you have an issue that you think he might be able to help with then please

feel free to email me with photos and details of the concern and we can see if he is able to help.

We regularly receive reports of works required that we pass onto Wiltshire Council for their attention. Did you know that there is a quick and easy way to report items such as potholes and issues with street lighting straight to Wiltshire Council? Search 'my wilts' app and follow the instructions. Once you have set up an account reporting is quick and simple.







Wellbeing notes

Mulled apple juice recipe

Apples are linked with so many customs and legends, from apple dunking at Halloween, to the story of King Arthur and his final journey to the isle of Avalon (from aballon, the old Welsh for 'apple'). It can be wonderful to walk our local fields at this time of year where, in places, crab apples cover the ground in a bobbly green carpet; or to stroll in our villages where branches festooned with blush-red apples hang over garden walls. As the days grow colder, apples seem to work especially well with spices, which are traditionally used to enhance immunity, reduce inflammation and relieve painful joints.

One of my favourite October recipes is mulled apple juice. It's easy to make, fragrant, warming and positively good for you. Feel free to vary the flavouring as you wish. You might add nutmeg or cloves, and perhaps orange peel or fresh ginger. I added six damsons recently, which created a rosé version, as illustrated here.



Ingredients

1 litre apple juice

1 orange

2 cinnamon sticks

2 star anise

Optional: 1 dsp honey

Method

Pour the apple juice into a saucepan and gently heat.

Squeeze half the orange into the apple juice. Slice the other half and put aside.

Add the cinnamon and star anise.

Simmer gently for around five minutes. Add the orange slices, and honey, if using, towards end. Pour into glasses and enjoy.
